Dr. Sue Grand is faculty and supervisor at the NYU Postdoctoral Program in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis; faculty, the trauma program at the National Institute for the Psychotherapies; faculty, the Mitchell Center for Relational Psychoanalysis; visiting scholar at the Psychoanalytic Institute of Northern California. She is on the editorial board of *Psychoanalytic Dialogues* and *Psychoanalysis Culture and Society*. She is the author of *The Reproduction of Evil: A Clinical and Cultural Perspective* and *The Hero in the Mirror: From Fear to Fortitude*.

With Jill Salberg, she has co-edited *Trans-generational Trauma and the Other: dialogues across history and difference* and *Wounds of History: repair and resilience in the trans-generational transmission of trauma*. With Lew Aron and Joyce Slochower, she has co-edited two recent books on relational theory. She is in private practice in NYC and in Teaneck, N.J.

Legacies of Violence: The We-ness of History

In psychoanalysis, the trans-generational turn has focus on our inherited wounds of our pre-history. In this workshop we will ask about another secret history: our legacies of violence. Many of us carry multiple, and shifting, historical positions, in which our forebears have been both victims and perpetrators. Our perpetrator ghosts are sequestered in cultural and familial dissociation. Knowing these histories can be destabilizing to ourselves and to our cultural narratives.

Utilizing readings from history, psychoanalysis, literature, as well as representations in film we will ask how these legacies define and effect us and how we can transform them.



This workshop will take place in an intimate setting (no more than 25 participants) over the course of 1 day (before the conference). 6 CEUs available.
